IN THE NEWS

Did you know that Baltimore City only has one social worker to support youth who become court involved? Her job is to assess "the complex needs of children charged with low- to moderate-level crimes," and connect them to services and support. Instead, "she estimates about 90% of her time is spent with teens charged as adults. That almost always leaves kids in juvenile court without a social worker, and decisions left to judges, prosecutors and others without O'Neill's expertise."
