The Commission on Juvenile Justice Reform & Emerging Best Practices

Created by HB814, <u>this Commission</u> is charged with oversight of Maryland's juvenile justice system and programming. They are also expected to review particular programming, submit reports, and make recommendations for potential policy changes. The Commission is comprised of 28 members, including four members of the General Assembly.

HIGHLIGHTS

The Commission was expected to convene this summer, but as of September 1, only four members have been named to the Commission. The Commission must hold regular meetings at least six times a year, but its first report is not due to lawmakers until Oct. 1, 2025. Read the Maryland Matters article <u>here</u>.

RECAP

MYJC hit back in an <u>8/25 letter to the</u> <u>editor</u> to correct the numbers and remind readers that being serious about youth safety means focusing on prevention, treating kids like kids, minimizing their contact with courts, and removing obstacles to success for young people touched by the system. 
